

Know Your Rights

Undocumented Migrants

Refugees

Asylum Seekers

Rights:

1. Right to **remain silent** and not disclose your undocumented immigration status (5th Amendment)
2. Right to **keep your door closed**, keep your belongings to yourself, and not engage with ICE officers
3. Right to **request identification of officers** (you can ask if they are federal agents, local law enforcement, border patrol)
4. Right to **demand a signed judicial warrant** before allowing them into your living space or car (4th Amendment)
5. Right **not to comply if they do not have a judicial warrant** (refuse to sign papers, refuse to let them into your space, refuse to disclose information).

Know Your Rights, pt. 2

Everyone has these rights in the United States.

Your immigration status doesn't matter.

If you are at home: You do not have to open the door or speak to agents unless they have a judicial warrant signed by a judge.

You have the right to **be free from harm.**

You have the right of an **interpreter** in any interaction with government officials

You have the right to **recieve copies** of any documents part of your case.
